# **Tipperary Road Safety Strategy 2018-2020**

## **Annual Report 2018**

### **Introduction**

June 2018 saw the launch of the first Road Safety Strategy for all of Tipperary covering the period 2018-2020. This is a joint strategy involving Tipperary County Council (TCC), An Garda Síochána (AGS), Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII), Road Safety Authority (RSA), Tipperary Fire and Rescue Services and Health Service Executive (HSE), through the National Ambulance Service.

The aim of the Strategy is to build on former road safety interventions and offer a strategic direction for road safety in Tipperary in terms of Education, Engineering, Enforcement and Evaluation. It reflects the National Road Safety Strategy 2013-2020 in its aims and objectives which are:

- To create a safer road environment in Tipperary for all road users
- To improve co-operation between the agencies and groups represented on the Road Safety Working Together Group (RSWTG)
- To improve road user behaviour by co-ordinating public education and awareness

It is designed to ensure a co-ordinated, collaborative and consistent approach to improving road safety for all road users in Tipperary and it targets actions to be delivered throughout Tipperary.

The Mission Statement contained in the strategy is "To create a greater awareness of road safety through all our stakeholders with the aim of reducing the number, severity and life-changing impact of road collisions, thereby making County Tipperary a safer place for all road users."

The Strategy sets the ambitious target of reducing fatalities and serious injuries to 4 and 10 respectively per year in County Tipperary by 2020. This would require a reduction of 69% on the 2016 figures.

### **Deaths on Irish Roads 2018**

Provisional road collision statistics for 2018 show that Ireland continued to improve its road safety performance by recording a 6% drop in road deaths compared to 2017, making it the safest year since road deaths were first recorded in 1959.

In the period January - December 2018 there were 139 fatal collisions resulting in 146 fatalities on Irish roads. This represents two fewer collisions and 10 fewer deaths compared to provisional Garda data for the full year of 2017.

Of the 146 fatalities, there were 60 Drivers killed, 20 Passengers, 42 Pedestrians, 15 Motorcyclists and 9 Pedal Cyclists.

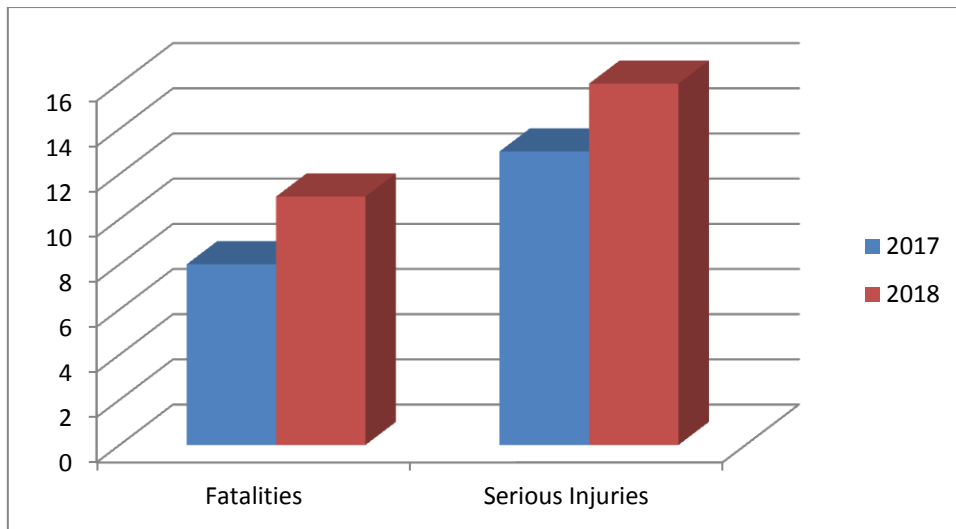
May (5) had the lowest number of fatalities in 2018. April (17) and June (16) were particularly dangerous.

The average number of deaths per month in 2018 (12 deaths per month) is less than the monthly average in 2017 (13).

Sunday (32) was the most dangerous day in 2018, followed by Tuesday (23).

In 2018, Cork (16) and Dublin (14) had the highest number of road fatalities.

Unfortunately, 2018 showed an increase in the number of fatalities and serious injuries in County Tipperary when compared with 2017. The number of fatalities rose from eight to eleven (an increase of 27%) and the number of serious injuries rose from 13 to 16 (an increase of 19%).

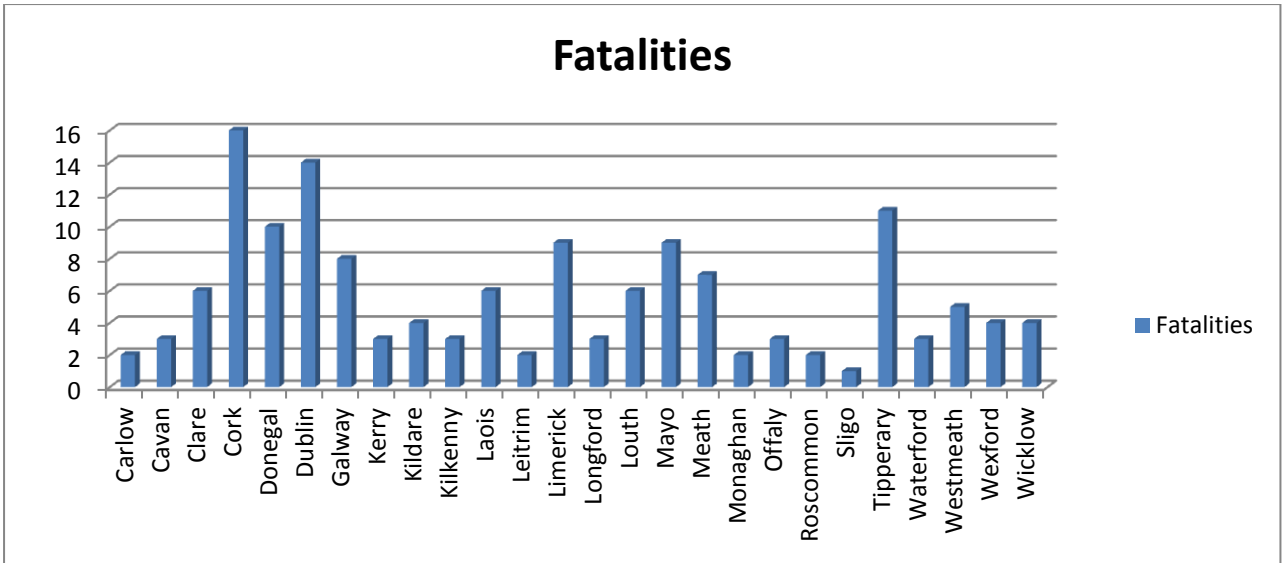


**Figure 1** shows the number of fatalities and serious injuries in County Tipperary in 2017 and 2018

Tipperary had the third highest number of fatalities in the country (11). Only Cork (16) and Dublin (14) had a higher number of fatalities.
