Call for Applications for the 2023 Golden Fleece Award

The Trustees of the Golden Fleece Award invite applications for the 2023 Golden Fleece Award.

The Golden Fleece Award provides funding for artists working in all forms of visual, craft and applied arts. It is the largest prize open to both artists and makers in Ireland, and it aims to provide resources for creative practitioners to innovate and develop their work at a critical point in their careers. Emerging, mid-career, and established artists and makers currently resident in or originally from the island of Ireland are eligible to apply.

The Golden Fleece Award is an independent artistic prize established as a charitable bequest by Dublin-born artist, designer and educator Lillias Mitchell (1915-2000). Her intentions were set out in her Letter of Wishes to her Trustees, in which she stated that: My wish is to give artists a 'boost' in times of particular need... A Trust was formed to manage the Award following her death, and the first Golden Fleece Award was presented in 2002.

All applications are assessed by a specialist five-person Advisory Panel. Members of the Advisory Panel review the applications received and select a shortlist, before making recommendations to the Award's Trustees, who decide each year how the prize fund will be distributed. The Advisory Panel for the 2023 Golden Fleece Award includes Angela O'Kelly (Panel Chair, jeweller and Head of Design for Body & Environment at NCAD, Dublin), Roger Bennett (woodturner), Hugh Mulholland (Creative Director, Visual Arts at the Mac, Belfast), Cliodhna Shaffrey (Director, Temple Bar Gallery + Studios, Dublin), and Dr Audrey Whitty (Head of Collections & Learning, National Museum of Ireland).

The Golden Fleece Award normally consists of one or more main Awards, to which may be added smaller Merit / Commendation / Special Awards. The size of the total prize fund is usually in the region of €20,000. How the fund is divided among recipients in any given year is at the Trustees' discretion. In recent years, Awards of €12,000, €10,000, €5,000, €4,000 and €3,000 have been made. As a guide, applicants are generally advised to apply for funding in the region of €5,000 to €10,000.

Applications must be made via the Online Application Form on the Golden Fleece Award website before the deadline: 5pm, Friday 25 November 2022

There is no entry fee. Shortlisted applicants will be notified in February 2023, and award recipients announced in March 2023.

Helium Arts invites applications from professional, multi-disciplinary Visual Artists with a strong collaborative and inclusive arts practice working with children and young people including children with disabilities to join our Artist Panel as Associate Artists. Artists will be contracted on a project to project, freelance basis over the next two years, to deliver our Creative Health Programme in community settings in counties Clare, Cork, Galway, Kerry, Limerick, Mayo, Roscommon, Sligo and Tipperary.

The role of Associate Artist is to deliver inspiring collaborative arts programmes which are responsive to the needs and vision of children and young people living with lifelong physical conditions and additional needs, including disabilities. Artists should have a genuine interest in building supportive relationships and a working understanding of inclusive arts practice relevant to the needs of participants, including a flexible approach to children and young people and how workshops are facilitated.

Training and continued professional development will be provided, with up to three required training days on Thursdays to take place in October 2022 and November 2022. Training includes artist shadowing opportunities. Successful applicants must complete the required training days to be eligible for freelance work in 2023.

Helium Arts is the national children's arts and health charity, developing the creativity of children living with lifelong physical conditions through the arts to support their wellbeing including social connections, self-esteem, and sense of agency.

Gallery Press Autumn Online Poetry Workshops

The Gallery Press are offering three online poetry workshops by Gallery authors: <u>Thomas McCarthy</u>, <u>Peter Sirr</u> and <u>Grace Wilentz</u>.

We invite two levels of applicants — Aspiring Writers and Emerging Writers. These courses will provide an ideal platform for participants to explore the creative process of writing under the guiding eye of an experienced, published poet in the company of a community of similar writers. Attention will also be paid to the procedures toward publication in magazine and book form.

We invite submissions from writers of all backgrounds and encourage underrepresented voices. Application is open to Irish poets (resident anywhere) and to poets currently resident in Ireland. Applicants must be over 18.

Each workshop is made up of four one-and-a-half-hour sessions which will take place once a week. A fee of €25.00 for your chosen workshop will be payable when a place has been offered and you have accepted the offer. Fees must be paid in full within three days of acceptance.

Workshops are limited to 12 participants. (See below to find which course best suits your level and schedule.)

Workshop fee €25.00 for four sessions. (Concessions available to unwaged/low income). Places will be offered based on work submitted. Please state which workshop interests you and send via email three sample poems together with a short biography (including information on any already published work) to books@gallerypress.com. Submissions should ideally be in Word or pdf format. (Please include all three of your poems in one document.)

Applications can be made from August 2nd for all workshops. We expect these workshops to fill quickly and advise early application. Booking will close on 30 September.

In addition to being a promotional tool for events taking place throughout Tipperary, this online festival calendar will also facilitate organisers in planning event dates by providing an accessible reference point for as many of the County's Cultural, Community and Sporting events as possible, acting as a "clash" calendar for organisers when setting dates for festivals and events.

The calendar is easy to use and organisers can register their events on the website. Cultural, Community and Sporting events are categorised under a range of headings and users may search by date or type of event. Categories include: Arts; Children's; Family; Comedy; Exhibitions; Fairs; Shows; Markets; Festival; Film; Heritage; Historical; Lectures; Readings; Music; Theatre, Sports & Outdoors.
