The Ethical Artist Webinar and Clinics Monday 24th January 2022 11 am

As part of our commitment to the Professional Development of artists, Tipperary, Clare & Limerick Arts Offices have arranged for VAI to host this webinar which will highlight best practice considerations and techniques for visual artists who wish to reduce their environmental impacts, use materials with more awareness, and create art that challenges our ecological and societal perspective.

This interactive webinar will be led by environmentalist John Thorne who has been Glasgow School of Art's Sustainability Coordinator since 2013: Working with designers, architects and artists his work seeks to broaden and deepen student experience, exploring how practice can connect us to ourselves and each other and promote social justice. It asks how can we emotionally support nature through art, and better engage people with environmental & ethical issues like climate change and biodiversity loss.

Decade of Centenaries - Minister Martin announces opening of Markievicz Award for 2022

The Department's Decade of Centenaries Markievicz Award bursary scheme for artists is open via the Arts Council's website on **and will close at 5.30pm on Thursday 10 February 2022.**

The Minister makes Awards under the scheme each year to up to 10 artists (either individual artists working alone or in collaboration with others) – to a value of €25k per individual or group. The Minister's department partners with the Arts Council on the administration of the scheme and the Minister will announce the award recipients for 2022 in April. Minister Catherine Martin launches Online Consultation on pilot Basic Income for the Arts

The pilot is set to open for applications early this year and will be available for artists and creative arts workers to support their practices

This online consultation offers the public the opportunity to feed into the policy development underpinning the pilot scheme

Catherine Martin TD, Minister for Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport and Media has launched an online consultation on the Basic Income for the Arts (BIA) pilot scheme to elicit the views of artists, those working in the arts and culture sector and the public.

The online consultation is now open and is available for response [here](#) until the consultation closes on 27 January 2022.

The online consultation follows a successful stakeholder forum on 15 December that saw over 150 participants from 50 artists and arts workers resource and representative bodies come together to discuss the proposal and provide their views and feedback to the Minister and her Department.

The purpose of the online consultation is to ensure that the general public, artists and those working in the arts and culture sector have the opportunity to contribute to the policy development for the pilot scheme and to offer suggestions from their experiences as artists, arts workers and members of resource organisations on key issues such as the schemes objectives, eligibility criteria, supporting emerging artists and participant responsibilities.

The Basic Income for the Arts pilot scheme will be launched in the coming months. Further details will be published on the Department's website after the feedback and input from the online consultation is assessed and finalised.

The bursary will be awarded to a student attending, or having been offered a confirmed place at, a University/ Music College or another accredited specialist music establishment undertaking classical music studies, either instrumental or vocal, in pursuit of a career in professional performance.

Six finalists will be invited to attend **Birr Festival of Music** from **Friday 29 April to Monday 2 May** to perform a 15-minute programme at Birr Theatre & Arts Centre on Sunday 1 May 2022 when bursaries will be awarded by a prestigious selection panel.

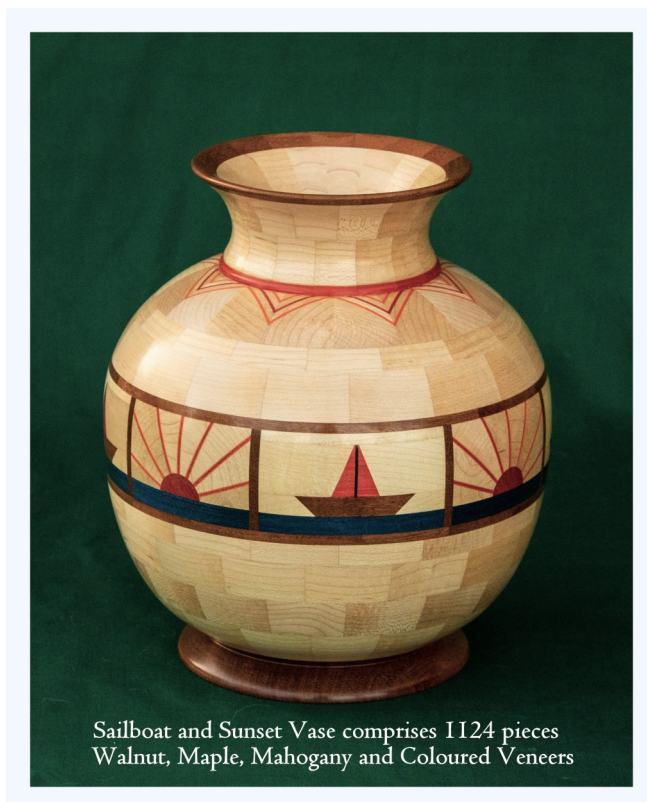

Is an online festival calendar to highlight and promote Festivals and Events across Tipperary which has been developed by Tipperary County Council.

In addition to being a promotional tool for events taking place throughout Tipperary, this online festival calendar will also facilitate organisers in planning event dates by providing an accessible reference point for as many of the County's Cultural, Community and Sporting events as possible, acting as a "clash" calendar for organisers when setting dates for festivals and events.

The calendar is easy to use and organisers can register their events on the website. Cultural, Community and Sporting events are categorised under a range of headings and users may search by date or type of event. Categories include: Arts; Children's; Family; Comedy; Exhibitions; Fairs; Shows; Markets; Festival; Film; Heritage; Historical; Lectures; Readings; Music; Theatre, Sports & Outdoors.
