Platform 31 is a nationwide artist development scheme by the 31 Local Authority Arts Offices in collaboration with the Arts Council of Ireland, designed to support and enable career development for 31 mid-career artists, all art forms. In 2022, participating artists will receive an €8,000 bursary to invest in themselves and their practice, combined with participation in a developmental and networking framework. The programme lasts for approx. 6 months from May to October 2022.

The repair and reuse of materials is a core part of the Circular Economy and an important contributor to global sustainability. The items that we throw out may still be fit for their original purpose – even if a bit of fixing up may be required. Tipperary County Council's Play It Again Instruments Project will involve getting the instruments repaired by local musician who will be engaged to check and test the instruments before they are passed on to their new homes. We will be distributing these repaired instruments to schools and various Comhaltas Ceoltoiri Eireann groups in Tipperary and other community organisations. Some of the instruments will be in excellent condition while others may require cleaning or minor repairs. Those that are beyond repair will be kept and used for parts.

Local Live Performance Programming Scheme Phase 3

Tipperary County Council invites quotations from producers/ promoters /venues /event management /professional production companies for the programming and delivery of services in relation to live outdoor performances to take place throughout Tipperary, in each of the five Municipal District (MD) areas, between mid-April and 30th June 2022.

The aim of this scheme is to assist producers, promoters, production companies and venues to provide support for people in the industry to facilitate programming of live outdoor performances, animating town centres for local communities from April to June 2022, in line with public health guidance. Performances can be recorded or streamed if health restrictions prevent live events or as local authorities deem appropriate.

Blas International Summer School Bursary.

Tipperary County Council is offering two bursaries to attend this year's summer school at the University of Limerick. The value of the bursary covers 1 week's tuition (one-week intensive of masterclasses, Irish language, lectures and concerts). The purpose of these bursaries is to support professional development of artists.

Applicants must be resident in the Tipperary administrative area.

Applicants must have achieved intermediate level of proficiency in their chosen area at a minimum e.g. (music/song/dance)

Payment of the bursaries will be made directly to the Blas International Summer School of Irish Traditional Music and Dance.

Applicants must be age 16 years+ (by 1st June 2022) (if under 18 years, written permission of parent/guardian to attend must be submitted at application stage)
Summer School Dates: 20th June - 1st July 2022.

Field Exchange Brookfield Farm | Tipperary - June to September 2022 John Gerrard

Deirdre O' Mahony in collaboration with the Loy Association of Ireland Series of Exchanges facilitated by National Organic Training Skillnets (NOTS)

Presented by Ailbhe Gerrard Co-produced by Ailbhe Gerrard and Culture Works Funded by Creative Ireland with the Department of the Environment, Climate and Communications | Creative Climate Action Fund

Field Exchange is where relationships between agriculture and creativity are examined and invigorated to combat climate change. Presented on Brookfield Farm on the shores of Lough Derg, Co Tipperary by farmer and climate ambassador Ailbhe Gerrard, The Exchange programme of creative agricultural topics is facilitated by the National Organic Training Skillnet (NOTS). The Exchanges are further contextualised and amplified by Model Plot, a sculptural planting by artist Deirdre O'Mahony in collaboration with the Loy Association of Ireland. Artist John Gerrard contributes a unique presentation of his simulation titled Corn Work. Field Exchange is funded by Creative Ireland + the inaugural Creative Climate Action Fund. The Exchanges provide farmers, food producers, artists, experts and the interested public space, time and community to collaborate. Field Exchange engages vision, knowledge and practical action to come together to solve our urgent challenges in agriculture, biodiversity and climate. It launches on the Summer Solstice, June 21st 2022 and is followed by twelve weeks of public open days + Exchanges, culminating in a closing conference on September 16, 2022.

AIC Scheme 2022 Round One

The Arts Council's Artist in the Community (AIC) Scheme, managed by Create, offers awards to enable artists and communities of place and/or interest to work together on projects. The AIC scheme is open to artists from any of the following artform disciplines: architecture, circus, street art and spectacle, dance, film, literature (Irish and English language), music, opera, theatre, visual arts and traditional arts. The aim of the AIC scheme is to encourage meaningful collaboration between communities of place and/or interest and artists. It is essential that consultation take place between the artist and the community, so that both parties are involved in deciding on the nature of the project's realisation. Group ownership of the art should be maintained at every stage.

Round One of the AIC Scheme is now open for applications, with a closing date on the **28th March 2022**, at **5pm**

Commercial Entertainment Capital Grant Scheme to reopen for applications.

The Commercial Entertainment Capital Grant Scheme, which has provided much needed funding for private sector performance venues, will reopen for applications on Tuesday, 1 March 2022 The scheme will remain open until **1pm on 31 May 2022** or **until the fund is exhausted**, whichever occurs first.

The main features of the scheme are:

- Grants will be paid to successful applicants as a contribution to the capital costs associated with re-opening after closures due to the COVID-19 pandemic
- €5m in capital funding is available to support commercial businesses operating from a premises in the arts, music and entertainment sector
- Sole traders, partnerships or incorporated entities that operate in the arts and culture sectors with turnover of €35,000 and over in 2019 will be able to apply
- Support will be offered by way of a payment to the value of 5% of the VAT-exclusive turnover of the arts and culture activity of the business for 2019, up to a maximum award of €25,000
- The scheme will reopen for applications at 1pm on 1 March 2022

As in 2021, the scheme will provide funding to facilitate capital works that assist organisations in reopening and continuing to operate safely for staff, customers and audiences.

Qualifying capital works include: installation or modification of ventilation systems; modification works to improve ventilation; modification to premises to improve the safety of staff and customers; installation of outdoor performance and audience facilities; weather protection for outdoor facilities; installation of facilities/structures that assist in crowd management or stewarding; security and health and safety equipment in accordance with the Work Safely Protocol; staging/streaming equipment.

Recipients of grants under the scheme in 2021 may apply under this scheme for different capital costs.

This scheme, with an allocation of €5m in 2022, is part of the €50m support package Minister Catherine Martin has made available for the Live Performance sector this year.

Music Capital Scheme 2022

The scheme, which comprises of three different awards, supports the purchase of musical instruments and is designed to respond to a broad range of capital needs within the music sector in Ireland.

The three awards available are outlined below; please note which awards are most relevant to your organisation:

- Music Capital Scheme Award 1 supports the purchase of musical instruments by non-professional performing groups.
- **Music Capital Scheme Award 2** supports the purchase of musical instruments by individual established professional performing musicians.
- **Music Capital Scheme Award 3** supports the purchase of musical instruments by individual emerging professional performing musicians.

Applications will be accepted until 2pm, Thursday 21st April 2022.




