Inside this issue



WHAT seeks an Artist in Residence in University Hospital Waterford

WHAT invites artists of all arts disciplines to apply to be Artist in Residence at UHW

Waterford Healing Arts Trust (WHAT) has issued an open call to artists of all arts disciplines to apply to be Artist in Residence at University Hospital Waterford (UHW) in 2022. The deadline for submission of applications is Thursday, 26 May 2022.

The Artist in Residence scheme is funded by the Arts Council. Click <u>here</u> for application requirements and further details.

The WHAT Artist in Residence programme is a means of engaging the hospital community in contemporary arts practice and an opportunity for artists to develop their professional practice within an acute hospital context. While the residency programme usually sees the successful artist collaborating with patients, the focus of the 2022 residency will be on engaging healthcare staff in collaborative/participatory arts experiences, with a view to creating new work and promoting staff morale and wellbeing. The artist(s) approach must adhere to UHW Infection Prevention and Control Guidelines.

The successful artist will be paid a fee and provided with a studio space at the WHAT Centre for Arts and Health at UHW and support from WHAT staff. Recent Artists in Residence at WHAT/ UHW include storyteller Joe Brennan, musician Catherine Sweeney Browne, the late Eric Sweeney (composer), poet Edward Denniston, and visual artists Ciara Harrison and Caroline Schofield.

Announcing details of the open call, Claire Meaney, Director of Waterford Healing Arts Trust, said "Staff at UHW have experienced many challenges over the past two years since the onset of COVID-19. With our 2022 Artist in Residence programme, we are now particularly interested in inspiring proposals which seek to offer innovative opportunities for staff to be creative, while also promoting staff morale and wellbeing. We have very creative staff at UHW, so we're looking forward to seeing how the 2022 Artist in Residence programme develops."

Established in 1993, WHAT brings arts experiences to the bedsides of patients at University Hospital Waterford (UHW) and other healthcare settings. RETHINK IRELAND OPENS €750,000 FUND FOR MUNSTER COMMUNITIES

Applications sought from Tipperary projects enhancing the physical and mental health of communities

Rethink Ireland has announced the opening of a €750,000 fund to support not-for-profit organisations, including charities and social enterprises, improving health outcomes in Tipperary and the larger Munster region.

The one-year Impact Fund will invest in up to 10 innovative projects that are promoting healthy lives and well-being for all across Munster. Up to five awards will be made to projects and/or organisations that use music, creativity, or the arts to enhance the physical and mental health of their communities.

The Impact Fund for Munster is backed by a number of local donors including the Parkes Family Limerick, The Sunflower Charitable Foundation, Community Foundation for Ireland, and several private donors, with match funding from the Department of Rural and Community Development via the Dormant Accounts Fund.

Alongside cash grants, successful applicants will secure a place on Rethink Ireland's accelerator programme and access a bespoke non-financial supports package that uses expert consultants to help strengthen and scale awarded projects.

Per Cent for Art Commission | Gaelscoil Chluain Meala, Tipperary

Gaelscoil Chluain Meala is situated in the heart of Irishtown Clonmel. The building, which our school has occupied since 1994 also served as a grammar school. Built in the 1830s, it is regarded as one of the oldest school buildings in the country. It was built initially as a school to teach English to the Irish and now it is a Gaelscoil where Irish is the language of instruction and central to everyday life. Our new facilities incorporate the new and old buildings. These are joined by a link corridor over the basement area. Our new school includes 16 classrooms, learning support & resource rooms, library, play areas, gardens, two outdoor learning spaces, GP room and playground.

Vision / Fís:

The theme we have chosen for our project is 'Oidhreacht'. 'Oidhreacht' translates as heritage and also means legacy, two sides of the same coin. Our building is so rich in history and heritage and has a new modern extension. The new school is the realisation of many years of dreams and aspirations and hard work. We would like the artwork to reflect that heritage and consider the legacy we are leaving to future generations of our hopes and dreams for the future of the Irish language in Clonmel.

Budget: The total budget for this commission is €36,000 inclusive of all costs, expenses, VAT, insurance, and other charges.

How We Age' all-island photography competition

The all-island competition, which is supported by the Irish Photographic Federation (IPF) and Northern Ireland Photographic Association (NIPA), is open for entries until the end of June and has several top prizes on offer.

The 'How We Age' competition seeks to capture the lived experiences of older people and is seeking images that show older people enjoying life and doing everyday activities.

Under the themes of 'Staying Active, Staying Social, Staying Connected', images should portray older people in an authentic and inclusive way - regardless of gender, sexual orientation, race, ethnicity, religion, politics, culture, ability, income, or post code.

The competition is free to enter, open to residents of Ireland and Northern Ireland over the age of 18, and is open for entries until **30 June 2022**.

Entrants can submit up to a maximum of three photos and all entries must be submitted via the online entry form on the IPH website, which can be accessed at www.publichealth.ie/photo. Acceptance of terms and conditions is a condition of entry.

Prizes include gift vouchers for photography equipment to the value of €/£500 for first prize, €/ £300 for second prize, and €/£100 for third prize, depending on where the winning entrants reside.

Bank of Ireland Begin Together Arts Fund - Third Round is Open

The third round of the Bank of Ireland Begin Together Arts Fund, in partnership with *Business to Arts* (The Fund) is open and will close on the **23**rd **of June 2022 at 5pm.**

The all-island Fund will make a total of €1 million in arts funding available over three years, awarded to projects that are enhancing the wellbeing of their communities.

Applicants can request funds between €5,000 – €15,000 / (or STG equivalent). Average grants will be €10,000 / (or STG equivalent), with maximum grants of €15,000 / (or STG equivalent). Artwork(s) / arts project(s) with larger budgets that have secured funds elsewhere are encouraged to apply.

The Fund supports or commissions artists and arts organisations to develop arts projects that engage the individuals, audiences and communities involved. **All art forms** are eligible to apply to The Fund. With this third round, Bank of Ireland and *Business to Arts* are encouraging applications from artists in any art form, which **enhance the wellbeing of their communities**.

For this third round, only projects that plan to take place between **October 2022 and December 2023** are eligible.



INSIDE | OUT

INSIDE/OUT is a project led by South Tipperary Arts Centre (STAC), as part of *Faoin Spéir- In the Open Clonmel* funded by the Arts Council of Ireland and in partnership with Tipperary County Council. INSIDE/OUT proposes to make the town of Clonmel an outdoor gallery, including mural/street art and large scale 2D art installations on buildings and walls around the town.

This installation of works by 7 artists, based in or originally from Tipperary, was selected through an Open Call and represents Phase 2 of INSIDE/OUT. This phase sees the artists' work presented on a large scale and installed at two locations around the town, Davis Rd. and Market St., bringing colour and life to the streets. A downloadable map is available.

Phase 3 of INSIDE/OUT will see artist Joe Caslin create a new temporary mural in the coming weeks which will be central to the exhibition and will also respond to the overarching theme of *Faoin Spéir- In the Open Clonmel*; 'Coming Out To Play'. This will be thecommission as part of this project, the first being 'Tread Softly' by Canvazwhich was installed last Autumn as Phase 1 of this project.

Joe Caslin is an Irish street artist, art teacher and activist. Best known for his beautifully rendered pencil drawings, which manifest as towering pieces of street art. His highly accessible work engages directly with the social issues of modern Ireland, on an unavoidable scale. Caslin confronts the subjects of suicide, drug addiction, economic marginalisation, marriage equality, stigma in mental health, direct provision, institutional power, inclusion, consent and most recently, the effects of the Covid19 pandemic on young people. The monochrome drawings Caslin creates hold a mirror up to the kind of society that we are, whilst asking us individually what kind of society we want to be a part of.


CLONMEL SONG CYCLE PRELUDE

Join composer and musician Eamon O'Malley as he presents a taste of the Clonmel Song Cycle, an outdoor performance spectacle of original music that breathes life in to some well-known and lesser-known characters from Clonmel's vivid history.

Eamon O'Malley is a Tipperary-based musician, composer, musical director and educator. He is the Musical Director of Up Roar Rock Chorus and Belle Voici. His first solo EP - Liminal Spaces Vol 1 - was released in December 2020 and is available to stream from all major platforms. He is also the creator and host of the Sofa Symphony Listening Party series - an online interactive listening party experience that focus on great works of concert music. He is a founder member of CLE, an electro-acoustic music and digital media ensemble based in Clonmel.

This project is funded by In the Open | Faoin Spéir - an <u>Arts Council Ireland</u> funded programme developed in response to the COVID-19 crisis for 2021 which will see a variety of outdoor arts events taking place in public spaces around Ireland. 
