Sean, having given his support for the Knockanrawley Resource Centre Retrofit Project, stated that in Tipperary, the LCDC and the relevant stakeholders need to be considering substituting polyurethane foam with Low Carbon materials such as Hemp which could potentially be grown by local farmers, thus also sustaining the rural economy

Isabel advised that she would link with Tipperary Energy Agency on this. There was also a query as to whether there will be an energy audit and Isabel confirmed that this could be written into the contract.

Administrative Matters Arising in respect of LEADER Projects:

Scout Hall Energy Retrofit

Isabel outlined details of an STDC request for approval for an adjustment to the minutes of the January meeting re the rate of aid on project STP 110810 – Scout Hall Energy Retrofit. That project amendment was recorded with the wrong project number (STP110339 - correct STP110810) and rate of aid (49.12649% - correct 49.15649%).

The background to this amendment is:-

Project STP110810 was put forward for provisional approval with an estimated cost of €106,829. LCDC approved STP110810 at the July 2019 meeting for €57,764.73 in grant aid (45.61% of procured capital cost of €126,643.30. However when the new procurement was assessed at Article 48, it was noted that the eligible costs of the project are capped at 110% of the estimate i.e. €106,829 *110% = €117,511.90 and that the grant aid should have been calculated on that basis. The Leader grant aid was re-calculated as (49.15649% of €117,511.90) = 57,764.73. (i.e. The same amount).

A request was made that the LCDC note this change of rate of aid in this month's minutes. Revised calculation is in bold.

Ballyhogan Country Kitchen

Michael outlined changes in respect to 30LDRntp108953 – Ballyhogan Country Kitchen: the promoter had to change suppliers for 2 items, an oven and a dough mixer due to single/3 phase electricity oven issue(the power supply to the property was not suitable or could not be upgraded) and a supplier not providing a Tax Clearance Certificate respectively. This occurred on April, 2019 and the revised procurement process for both changes was approved by the DRCD at this time and a note to file with associated correspondence has been uploaded on the CRM. The final claim is now being processed and the Article 48 check requires the LCDC to retrospectively approve the changes approved by the DRDC. The original approved expenditure amount for each item as per the original RDP contract issues does not change.

Tipperary Boutique Distillery STP101376

Sean has been encouraged by the number of people who have been seeking seeds and the focus on growing that has come about as a result of the crisis.

Healthy Tipperary

Fiona gave an update in relation to Healthy Ireland and referred a review of the National Healthy Ireland Strategy which she had previously circulated and asked all members to participate and help inform the next national strategy before the closing date of 30th April. Fiona advised that the review of the Healthy Tipperary Plan and delivery will be brought to the LCDC at a later meeting. Since the inception of the Healthy Ireland funding there has been great collaboration and partnership within the county and a joint application has been submitted for Tipperary with the LCDC and CYPSC. Tipperary is one of only 4 counties where joint LCDC & CYPSC application is submitted. The LCDC CYPSC and Pobal approved the 13 Tipperary actions in January. National provision has been providing an extension on actions from June 2020 to June 2021 and to enable LCDC & CYPSC to submit revised actions in light of Covid as the timelines and delivery on some of the actions will be hard to meet.

On the 9th April the Fiona circulated correspondence to the members to reduce each action by €1,000 and community engagement by €3,000 to ringfence money for new projects such as the resilience and comfort packages, thermometers and food for hospitality overnight stay. Fiona advised that there may need to be other revised actions if the restrictions continue to impact on delivery of services.
