Description:	The tennis club application to the LEADER Cooperation Fund is for Phase 2, the tennis dome to cover the two new courts. Phase 1 groundworks are complete using club funding, a loan and Tomar Trust funding. Phase 1 has had LEADER Cooperation Fund grant approval. Phase 4 has a longer timeline as there is an existing modest clubhouse but the increased demand anticipated due to the tennis dome will require a large clubhouse in time.  NOTE: This project was initially approved as project 30LDRntp107817 for a €99,828.50 grant from NTDC (26.58% of TEC of €375,484). CLDC were matching this amount and %. Due to C19, the work commencement was delayed and the winning tenderer has withdrawn, stating he cannot do the job for the money due to costs inflation. DRCD advised both CLDC and NTDC to close the old project decommiting the grant funding and for the promoter to return to e-tender the work and to submit a new project application. The new TEC is €489,776.49, an increase in TEC of c.30%. The grant amount now being sought remains the same, €99,828.50 each as previously but with a reduced contribution (20.38% of TEC of €489,776.49) each from both CLDC and NTDC.
