

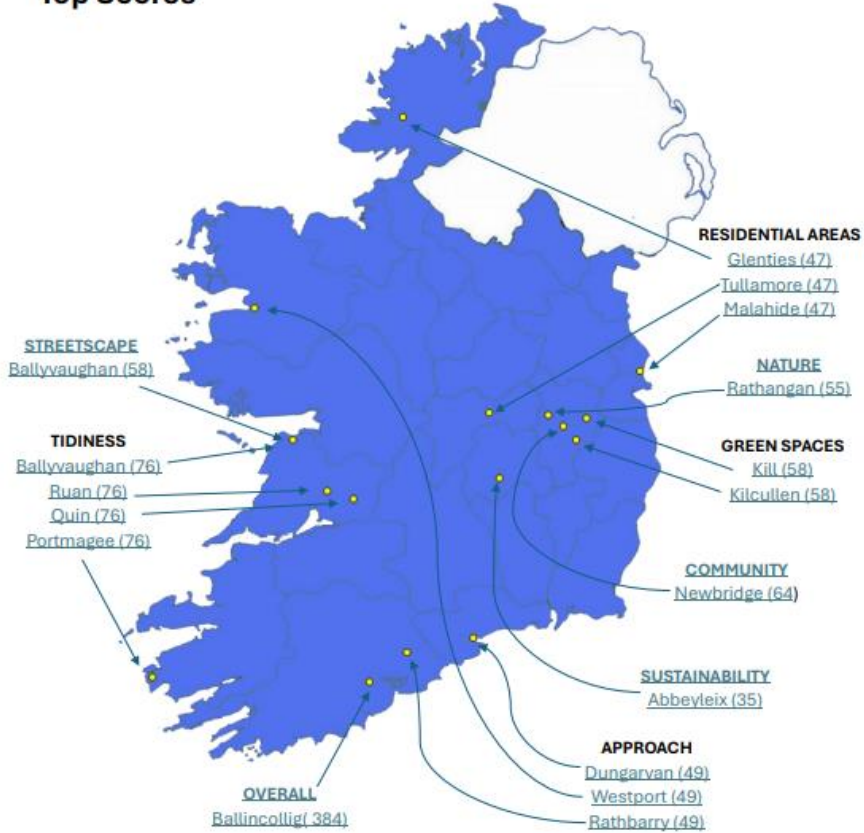

- Tipperary had 80 Entries in 2024 – very high level of participation in the National Competition

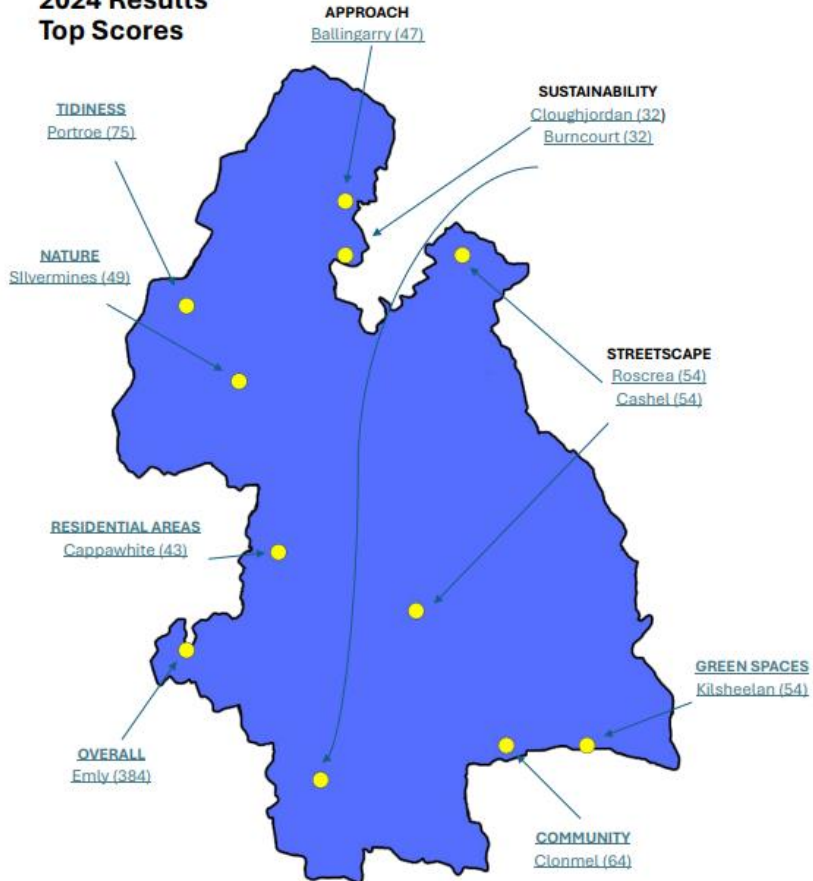

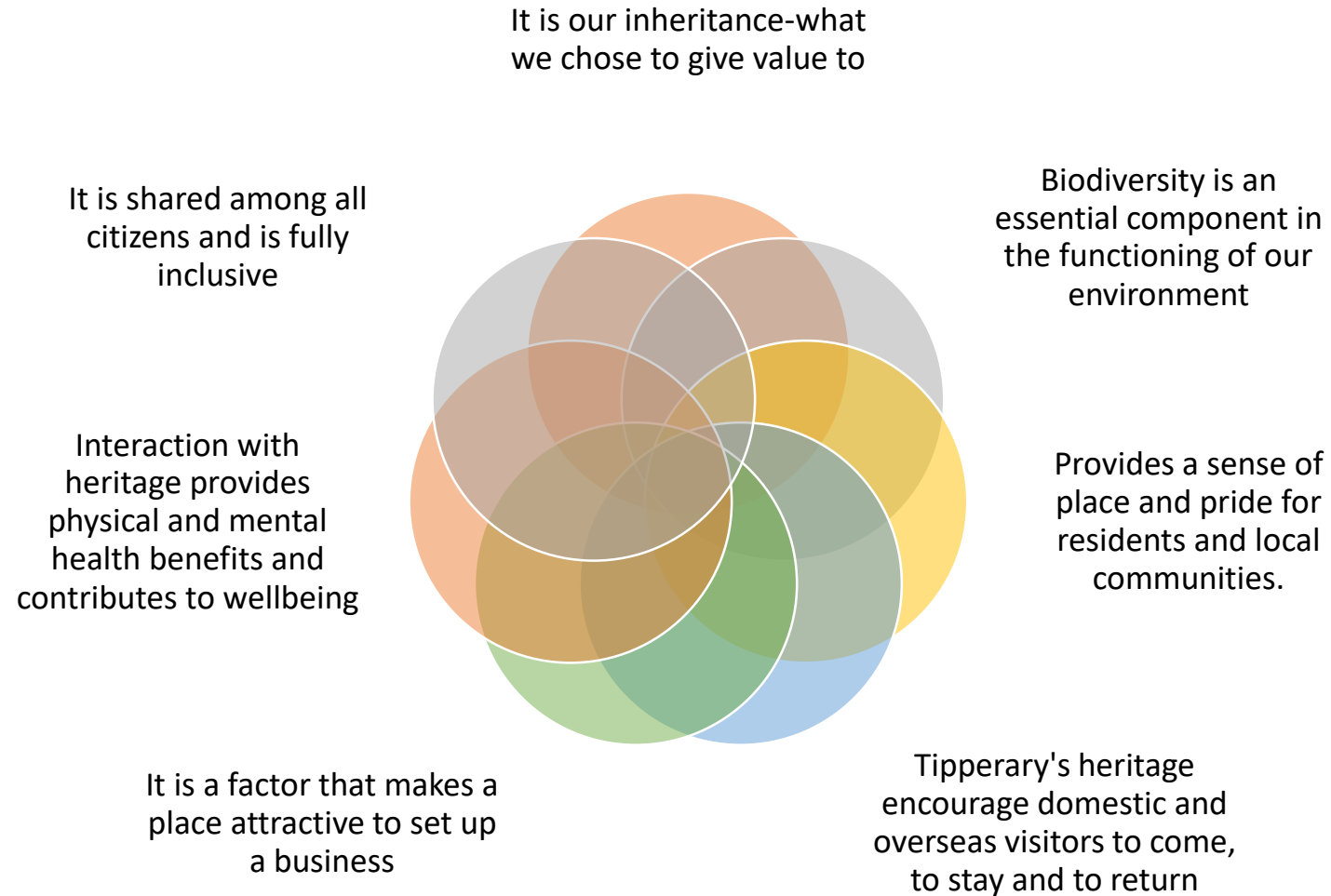
What is Heritage ?

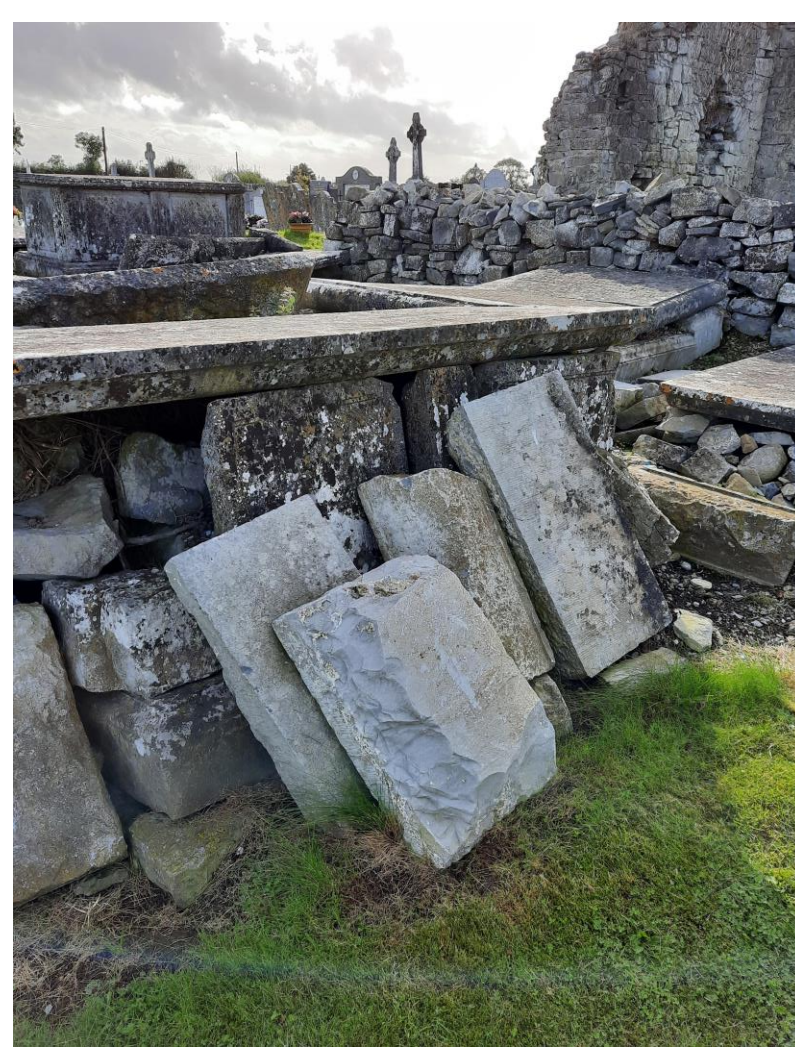

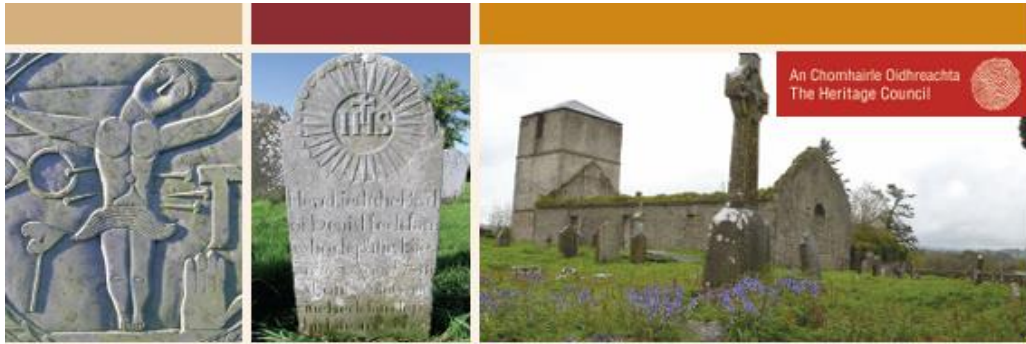

Recording of Historic Graveyards



Historic graveyards places of significant human activity

- Resting place for departed and places of remembrance
- Heritage value in archaeology, architecture, folk art
- Wildlife habitats
- Repositories of local genealogy



Top Tips for caring for your Historic Graveyard

BEFORE YOU BEGIN

- Always consult your **Local Authority Heritage Officer** for advice on best practice.
- **Check ownership of the graveyard** and seek the owner's permission.
- Carefully consider the impact of what you are planning. **Work should enhance the character and setting**, taking into account both built and natural heritage value.
- Works that may involve **ground disturbance or work to built fabric** require consultation with National Monuments Service. The necessary guidance can be found [HERE](#).
- **Make a plan!** A plan should describe the condition of the various features in the graveyard and what work is required. A useful template prepared by **HISTORIC GRAVES** can be found [HERE](#).

MASONRY AND MEMORIALS

- **Get the necessary expert advice** for repair or conservation of structural remains.
- **Keep pathways clear of vegetation.**
- **Boundary walls should be maintained with care** e.g. by reusing original stone, keeping original features like stiles and using recessed pointing.

THINGS TO AVOID

- **Excessive mowing and use of herbicides** as these impact native plants, insects and animals.
- **Removal of ivy** from ruins without expert advice and supervision.
- **Power washing, sand blasting or chemical treatment of headstones.** Modern recording methods can now be used to read many difficult to decipher inscriptions.
- **Attempts to flatten the 'humps and bumps'** of the surface and unnecessary removal of headstones (e.g. to place against a wall). This seriously affects the character of the graveyard.
- **Using tarmac or concrete** on new or existing pathways.

NATURAL HERITAGE – BIRDS, BEES AND BATS

- Consider leaving part of the graveyard **unmown to benefit pollinators** like bees.
- **Boundary walls** are important habitats for many insects, interesting flora and even small animals and birds.
- **Let the dandelions bloom!** They are an important early food source for pollinators. You can find out more about the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan [HERE](#).
- If carrying out works on towers, roofs or crypts, **consider carrying out a bat survey.**
- **Hedges and trees** should only be trimmed between 1st September and 1st March.
- **Deep rooted trees** like sycamore can cause damage to boundary walls and other structures. Get advice on cutting back or removing larger trees and remove saplings.

Recap – What is Biodiversity?

- Biodiversity or biological diversity is the variety of all living things on earth and includes
 - Genetic diversity (genes)
 - Specific diversity (species)
 - Ecological diversity (ecosystems)
- Biodiversity, therefore, includes everything from bacteria, insects, birds, mammals, amphibians, plants and fungi, to larger habitats and ecosystems such as woodlands, grasslands, Wetlands etc.



Why does biodiversity matter?

- It provides us with essential ecosystem services such as clean air, water purification, climate regulation, pollination, pest control, fuel., recreation, medicine.....
- The value of ecosystem services in Ireland alone is €2.6 billion annually!!

Understanding Biodiversity Scoring

- **Key Criteria –** Each entrant is assessed under eight criteria with a total of 470 marks available as follows :

Community-Your Planning & Involvement	60
Streetscape & Public Places	60
Green Spaces & Landscaping	60
Nature & Biodiversity in your Locality	50
Sustainability-Doing more with less	50
Tidiness & Litter Control	90
Residential Streets & Housing Areas	50
Approach Roads, Streets & Lanes	50



Adjudication for Biodiversity

- Knowing and understanding Nature in your local area
- Habitats and Species in your local area
- Actions for Nature and Biodiversity
- Education and Awareness



Know and understanding your local area

- What habitats are present? - Rivers, lakes, grassland, woodland, stonewalls, parks etc....
- First step is habitat survey and mapping – Community Foundation of Ireland Grants available
- Are there protected areas? – PNHA's, NHA's, SAC's, SPA's, Nature Reserves
- Legislation – Wildlife Act 1976- 2023, The Habitats Directive, The Birds Directive
- Species in your local area (may influence some or your Actions)

Habitat Management

- Looking at habitats in local area and how to improve management
 - Grass management (long-flowering meadow, 6 week meadow)
 - Hedgerow management
 - Removing non-native species (may need to seek expert advice, legislation)
 - Avoid clearance of ivy, lichens, mosses from stonewalls/buildings
- Be aware of areas within SAC's, SPA's, NHA's (legislative requirements)
- Avoid use of pesticides
- Be aware of effects of lighting on sensitive species



Habitat Creation

- Start small
- Planting native hedgerow
- Banks for solitary bees
- Small pond
- Orchard or small urban woodland
- Meadows
- Ecological networks

Actions for Biodiversity

- **A Local Biodiversity Action Plan (LBAP)** – written by an ecologist (usually) - sets objectives and actions for specific habitat/area within your locality (Community Foundation of Ireland)
- **Habitat Management and creation** – Grass management, vegetation management, planting
- **Surveys and monitoring** – Wildflowers, insects, birds, mammals
 - Can show how what you currently have and how previous biodiversity enhancements have positively impacted biodiversity,
 - **Pollinators** – Actions should follow All – Ireland Pollinator Plan

Actions for Biodiversity

- **Tree/ hedge planting** – Right trees in right place, native trees of Irish provenance
- **Create ecological networks** – Create a map of areas currently managed for pollinators, look to extend
- **Community engagement and awareness** – Social media, community events, engaging schools



Showcasing your application

- **Clearly present your achievements, projects and community engagement!!**
- Clearly present or outline each of the elements (Green spaces and landscaping, Nature and Biodiversity, Residential areas etc...)
- Keep in concise, use bullet points where possible
- Use good visuals
 - Short videos
 - Before and after photos (improvements and public spaces, pollinator planting, sustainability).
 - 6 photos per page

Showcasing your application

- Map and plans for projects – Ecological networks, pollinator planting, tree planting
- Highlight Community Involvement – Keep track of no. of volunteers participating, take photos
- Highlight partnerships with local schools, businesses, LA
- Include photos from events
- Showcase any data you may have gathered – biodiversity project (this is where surveys are useful).
- Clearly show Social media platform and include links and use hashtags

Showcasing your application

- Outline any planned projects and the benefits for biodiversity
- How will future projects improve your town/village
- If issues are present, such as an invasive species, outline a plan for management

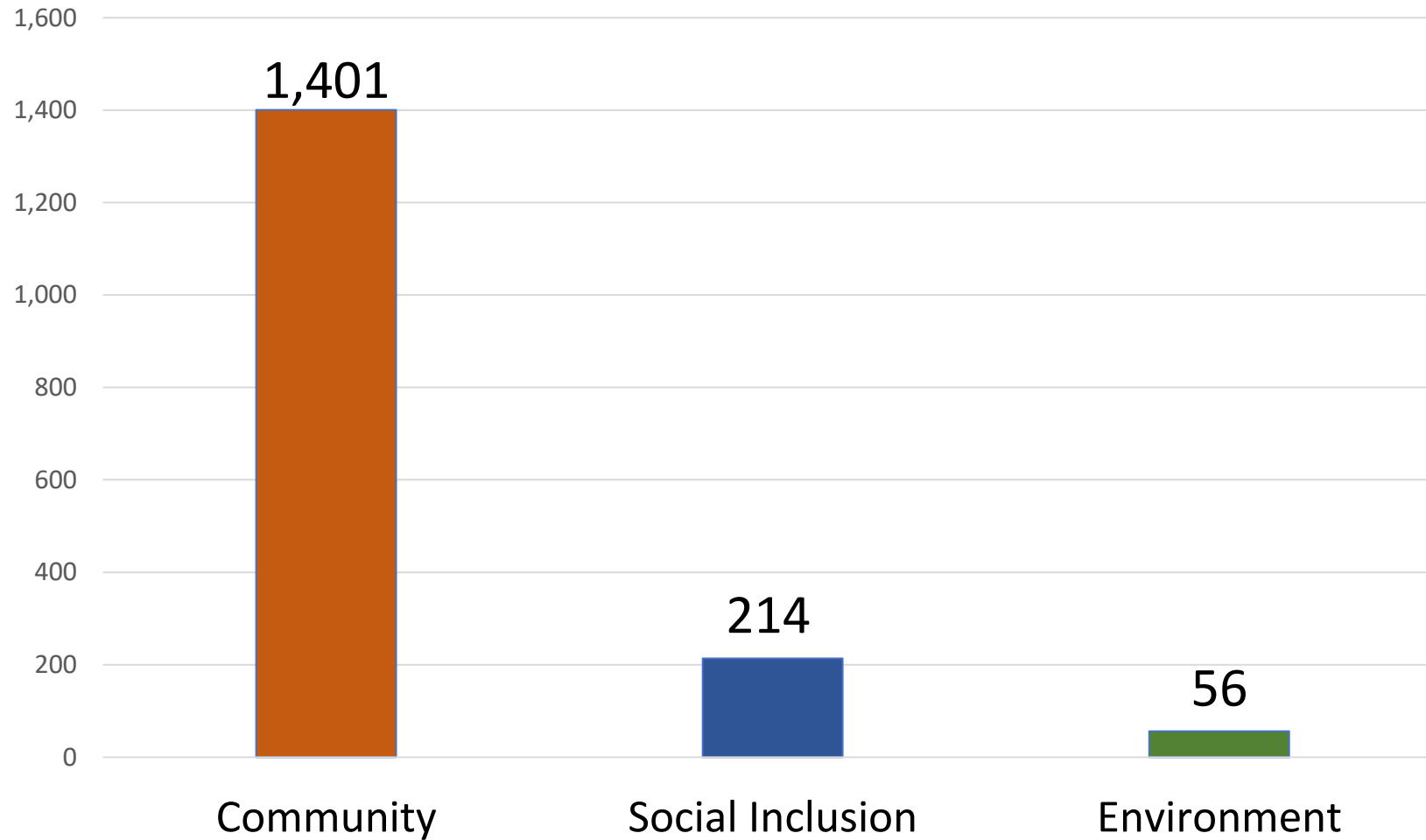

Types of funding

Project Type	Max Grant rates	Max Grant Non profit
Capital eg Building works, equipment, landscaping, planting and marketing	75%	€5k to €200k
Feasibility studies, Research	90%	€5k to €30k
Training	100%	€5k to €200k

- ▶ Typically, 3 months from submission of application to signing contract and project start
- ▶ Works carried out before contract signed are NOT eligible

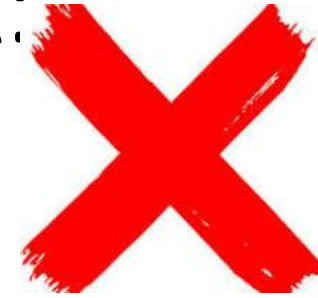


Environmental Projects



- Improve biodiversity;
- Restore and develop habitats, including eradicating invasive species;
- Community Gardens
- Improve water quality on lakes, rivers and streams, and conserve water resources;
- Facilitate energy conservation, and renewable energy initiatives.
- Support waste reduction, upcycling and the circular economy

What is NOT Eligible under LEADER:



- Conventional Retail Operations
- Running costs / maintenance / salaries
- Conventional Motor Vehicles (inc. Farm/Industrial/Construction)
- Improvements/Refurbishments to Private Residential Property / Mainstream Tourist Accommodation
- Planning application fees
- Support for Mainstream Activities of Mainstream Sporting Organisations
- Primary Agriculture, Horticulture & Fisheries
- Housing, Healthcare & Education

LEADER application process

- ▶ Requires time and effort
- ▶ Detailed Application form
- ▶ Supporting Documents
 - ▶ Planning Permission
 - ▶ Ownership / Formal Lease / Formal Agreement
 - ▶ Seek 3-5 quotations for the work based on detailed specification
 - ▶ Accounts / Bank statements / Governing Documents etc

- Tipperary LECP Action to undertake Community Capacity and Community Organisation Audit
- There are 1756 number of community Groups registered with Tipperary Public Participation Network in County Tipperary (The planned survey will exclude Burial Ground and Residents Associations in the first round)
- This audit will reflect the physical infrastructure and fabric of the community facility
- This audit will also reflect the social capital of the community group

The tapestry of Community

- The survey/audit is currently being finalised with input from Climate Action, Health and Wellbeing, Tipperary PPN and other stakeholders.
- Tipperary PPN will be a full partner on this project
- Each physical community facility will be visited. Each of these facilities will have photos of entrances, disability access, video conferencing, green infrastructure, energy upgrades completed or required captured with their records
- They will also be engaged to ascertain their social capital, their current capacity, their capacity and volunteer requirements, areas of interest, areas to develop, training required
- Each community group without a facility will also be engaged and their social capital will be recorded.
- We will also ascertain their ability and willingness to engage in Community/Emergency Response
- The survey questionnaire will be built in www.submit.com portal.
- Each property or group will be identified by the PPN ID Number.
- The location for each audit will have an EIRCODE for mapping
- Tipperary County Council Website to host this information



Local Links

- We will be able to identify areas of interest/clusters of interest and work with Tipperary ETB, Tipperary PPN, Tipperary Volunteer Centre, Tipperary Sports Partnership etc to provide targeted training
- The audit will provide the staff within the Local Development Companies with groups that need support and mentoring
- We will also ascertain what activities that currently take place at the premises and showcase these on <https://whatsonintipp.ie/>
- The audit will provide each physical location with a sign with their EIRCODE and QR code. The QR Code will lead back to Tipperary County Council website portal.

Understanding Our Community's Needs

- A dedicated team of staff from Tipperary Public Participation Network and Tipperary Community Team will conduct the surveys.
- Each survey engagement could take 2-3 hours
- We plan to commence end of Q1 2025
- We will begin with the Carrick on Suir MD, followed by Thurles MD, followed by Nenagh MD, Tipperary Cahir Cashel MD and Clonmel BD
- We anticipate that it will take potentially 12 to 18 months to fully conclude the project
- This information will support Tipperary County Council and LCDC and inform us of community needs within the county
- The website portal will be populated at intervals as areas are concluded
