

THE TYRONE GUTHRIE CENTRE REGIONAL BURSARY SCHEME 2025

Guidelines

Tipperary County Council will fund two bursary awards to professional artists living in Tipperary to develop work at the County Monaghan workplace for artists.

Each Bursary covers a **one-week stay** at the Tyrone Guthrie Centre at Annaghmakerrig, Co. Monaghan. Facilities at the Centre include artist studios, music room, dark room, acoustic recording studio and performance/dance space. There is wheelchair accessible accommodation as well as the possibility of an artist being accompanied by a carer. Please note the "Big House" cannot cater for those with particular food requirements so self-catering is the best option for those in that category.

The successful artist will agree the dates and required space directly with the Tyrone Guthrie Centre. Please visit www.tyroneguthrie.ie for further information on the centre.

Applicants that have been funded under this scheme in 2022, 2023 or 2024 are ineligible to apply for the 2025 scheme.

This scheme is open to professional artists, over 18 years of age (at time of application) working in all art forms, living in the Tipperary Administrative area.
