
Call Applications

Artist Tom Meskell brings his touring installation *Basking* to the 6s & 7s Gallery in Tipperary Town this November with *Basking – The Nursery*, an immersive light installation celebrating the gentle mystery of the basking shark.

The initial Installation in July of this year in Roscommon Arts Centre focused on the adult Basking Shark, this show is inspired by the rarely seen early life of these ocean giants.

The Nursery transforms the gallery into a glowing underwater world of light and sound. Four illuminated basking shark pups, each over six feet long, will appear to swim through the space alongside moon jellies and plankton created by local schools and community groups.

Working in collaboration with local artists, Meskell will build the installation over twelve days, sharing advanced lantern-making and installation techniques. Community engagement will include workshops with primary school children, and a teenage group, whose creations will become part of the final installation. In addition to this, an artist talk will take place on Saturday 15 November at 11am which is open to the public.

The beautiful soundscape was composed for this project by Colm O'Snodaigh and Brian Hogan.

"This iteration of *Basking* is allowing me to explore different formats the project can take — being inspired by the new space and context in Tipperary," says artist Tom Meskell.

The project is supported by The Irish Basking Shark Group, bringing the wonder and reality of these remarkable creatures to life.

This project takes place as part of Tipperary County Council's Arts Programme with the support of the Arts Council and in cooperation with Creative Places Tipperary Town.

Audio Description Training—Open Call to Attend Audition on Tuesday 25 November, 2025

In Spring 2026, Arts & Disability Ireland, The Lir Academy, National Academy of Dramatic Arts and Mind's Eye Audio Description will run a training course in Audio Description in Dublin.

The Course will equip learners with the necessary skills and techniques to work as free-lance audio describers in theatre, with transferable skills for film, television and visual arts.

The course will cover:

- Visual impairment awareness and guiding
- The scripting and delivery of audio description
- Learning how to lead a touch tour
- Developing language and vocal skills
- Operating audio description equipment

Application Process:

The Application process is in two phases:

Stage 1: Interested applicants are requested to submit a CV and a short paragraph (50 words) on why you think you would make a good audio describer. Please email to jenny@adiarts.e

Closing Date for submissions is 18.00 on Monday 10th November

Stage 2: Shortlisted applicants will be required to attend an Information and Audition Day which will take place in Dublin on **Tuesday 25 November**, from 11.30—15.30 at The Lir Academy.

Course Fee: €300

This covers lunch on the first and last day, tea and coffee during the sessions, and your theatre tickets. Course participants are responsible for their own travel and accommodation costs.


By the end of the workshop, we're hoping each learner would have the confidence and ability to open a Digital Audio Workstation (DAW) for their own use.
