<b>Item 2. To consider and adopt Minutes of the April Meeting held on 16<sup>th</sup> April 2026</b>	It was proposed by Cllr. Carroll and seconded by Cllr. Bonfield and resolved that the minutes of the April Meeting held on 16 <sup>th</sup> April be adopted.
<b>Item 3. To receive update from Environment</b>	<p>The report from Environment was circulated to members.</p> <p>Cllr. Quirke O'Meara asked if the survey on historical landfills will take in the surrounding area and if there will be a mattress amnesty soon.</p> <p>Cllr. Morris stated that Tipperary County Council has a substantial Climate Action Plan, but the Government's Critical Infrastructure Bill will undermine it. The Minister can decide to approve projects e.g. data centres without considering the effect on climate action. A lot of boxes must be ticked in relation to the Eastern Midlands water scheme to protect the environment. People can go to court to object, but they will not be able to claim costs. TDs are voting to take climate action out of any future critical infrastructure projects. He requested that Environment Section invite environmental groups from the Mid-West region to a meeting hosted by the Council to see how we can put a concentrated coordinated campaign in place to protect the Environment in the Mid-West region i.e. Eastern and Midlands WSP and the attempt by the Government to disapply Section 15 of the Climate Act in the Critical infrastructure bill .</p>



	<p>Cllr. Bugler said it was a pity that TCC did not make a submission on this bill. Voluntary groups do have environmental concerns but will have to come up with the money if they want to take a judicial review of any of these projects. She thanked Mr. Rúairí Boland for his work on Boher burial ground and asked if something could be done with the landfill in Ballina as it is very unsightly. She thanked the environment staff for the help with National Spring Clean week and the work on the Kilmastualla River. She asked for information on what areas can apply for the septic tank and well grants.</p> <p>Cllr. Carroll enquired about prosecutions for litter offences and if there will be any increase in litter fines. Cllr. M. O'Meara stated that great work has been done on the Shannon Vermi Composting site and it appears to be 95% complete. He asked when it is expected to be completed and if it was possible to get the costs back.</p> <p>Ms. S. Scully said that the survey will be on the landfill only in the Silvermines. Litter and dog fines will be increased to €250 in September; and an amount of waste must be left at the site at Shannon Vermi Compost while legal proceedings are ongoing. She said she would revert in relation to meeting with Environmental Groups. Mr R. Boland informed members that there will be a mattress amnesty later in the year.</p>
<p><b>Item 4. To receive update from LAWPRO</b></p>	<p>The report from LAWPRO was circulated to members.</p> <p>Cllr. Morris expressed concerns about the monitoring of discharge pipes especially from Uisce Éireann facilities. He said that recently there was a discharge at O'Brien's Bridge and the alarms at the plant had been turned off for a few weeks. Uisce Éireann have a poor record on rivers, and he is not sure if the EPA currently have enough power. He was concerned that there is no drainage committee or similar group responsible for the rivers in towns.</p> <p>Cllr. Quirke O'Meara expressed her thanks for the support given to Toor Tidy Towns and Kilcommon. Cllr. Carroll asked about the types of grants for Nature Based Solutions. Cllr. M. O'Meara enquired about the reasons for some rivers improving and some not. He understands soil type can have an influence, but farmers are willing to embrace what needs to be done to improve water quality.</p> <p>Cllr. Bugler asked if the water is tested in Lough Derg, she has concerns that Uisce Éireann are not removing nitrates, but the EPA has issued a tertiary treatment licence. She stated that funding is required to address the issues of Japanese knotweed and zebra mussels. Cllr. Bonfield said giant hogweed is also an issue along the Mulcair River.</p> <p>Ms. M. Morrissey explained that while water quality has disimproved there also has been improvement in some areas.</p>



	Measures are now starting to be put in place but anything to improve water quality will be a slow process. It is difficult to know what is causing the decline in Tipperary, it may be historical drainage issues. Rain gardens are very popular nature-based solutions. She advised that there would be training for Councillors at end of June. She will follow up on the discharge pipe on Lough Derg and she informed members that LAWPRO do not have a role in policy but do provide the science to the Department and to Teagasc. LAWPRO have also applied for more money for EIP.

Representatives from Newport and Nenagh Town Teams attended. Presentations were made from the National Town Centre First Office, the Nighttime Economy advisory service, the SEAI as well as staff from the Planning,</p>										



Housing, Environment, Climate Change and Capital Projects teams.

**Rialto Digital & Enterprise Hub:**

Engagement is continuing with Enterprise Ireland on potential funding application for the Rialto under the Smart Regions Enterprise Innovation Scheme.

**Nenagh Town Park Extension:**

- Following a tender process Lead Engineer, Ecologist and Landscaper have been appointed to prepare a concept design for the extension of Nenagh Town Park with a view to progressing to planning stage.
- Design is ongoing – ecologist reports/screening and civil/structural drawings completed.
- Submission of options from landscaper has been received and is under consideration.
- Aim is to submit for Planning (Part 8) Q2 2026.

**Nenagh Historic and Cultural Quarter:**

- Works have been completed on the conservation works to the windows of the Governor’s House funded under the Built Heritage Investment Scheme and the GMA. The additional three windows that have been restored have been painted and re-installed.
- The 3-storey Gaol Block has been approved for funding under the Town & Village Renewal Scheme. Grant is for €500,000. With matched funding this will allow an investment of €555,555 in this historic heritage building with a view to bringing it back into public use. Formal notification of approval has been received and Part 8 planning is already in place. A tender competition was undertaken for an Integrated Design Team for stage (ii) to (iv) of the Capital Works Management Framework for this project. Two tenders were received and have been assessed. Appointment of successful tenderer will be finalised in the near future. In addition to the funding for the conservation/ construction works the project also involves the development of the experience which will be delivered to the public. This will be tendered for separately.
- We will continue to strive to source funding for the various proposals in relation to the Historic & Cultural Quarter as funding calls open up. A call for Cat 1 projects under RRDF is now open – closing date for submissions is July 2026. Work is in progress on the preparation of an application in relation to elements of the Historic & Cultural Quarter. An internal Steering Group has been established to progress the application. Meetings are on-going with stakeholders such as Fáilte Ireland and the OPW.



**Nenagh Centre of Excellence:**

- Work is progressing on initial design and the red-line boundary for the development has been agreed with the design team and the property owners.
- Agreement has been reached with the property owners. Draft contracts are currently being reviewed by our solicitors. These contracts will be subject to Part 8 planning being secured.
- The Design Team have been requested to progress the design and planning now that the site layout has been agreed.
- It is aimed to submit planning through Part 8 process in Q4 2026/Q1 2027.

**RRDF Call 4 – Category 2:**

- An allocation of €1 million has been awarded under RRDF Call 4 – Category 2 for a Town Centre Regeneration Project in Killaloe-Ballina. The lead authority for this is Clare County Council. The funding is for design and planning with a view to submitting a future application under Category 1 for funding to deliver the project. Meetings have taken place with Clare with a view to progressing this project.

**Nenagh Transport Hub:**

Engagement with NTA on the development of a Transport Hub and the proposed relocation of the bus stops to the Railway Station is on-going.

**Platforms for Growth- Dromineer:**

- Hoarding has been taken down.
- Landscaping is in progress.
- Signage has been approved to go forward for manufacture and erection. This will need to be in place before the facility is opened to the public.
- Contractors are on site for the installation of the Access Control System.
- Second fix plumbing issues have been completed.
- Eircode has been obtained for the facility.
- Tiling and studding of walls is in progress.
- Works have been undertaken at the Car Park.
- Objective is to have facility open to the public by mid-June.

**Casual Trading Bye-Laws:**

- A total of 24 Casual Trading applications were received for 2026 covering Dromineer, Ballina, Garrykennedy, Castlelough, The Lookout, Clare Glens and Newport.
- Applicants have been notified of the decisions on their applications.
- 8 Casual Traders have been offered permits to trade at 7 locations (10 pitches) located in Ballina, Castlelough, Clare Glens, Dromineer, Garrykennedy, Newport and The Lookout.
- 7 Casual Traders have received their permits to trade, the offer of a casual trading permit for one location has been withdrawn as the conditions of the scheme have not been complied with.



	<p>An assessment is currently being carried out of alternative options for this location based on range of services and expressions of interest received.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 1 Event Licence was issued for St Patrick's Day, Nenagh.</li></ul> <p><b><u>Lands at Stereame:</u></b> Discussions are ongoing in conjunction with Housing Section on options to progress the provision of private housing in Stereame.</p> <p><b><u>Designated Bathing Area - Dromineer:</u></b> Interviews have been held for lifeguard positions for Dromineer. Following training seven candidates have been successful. Garda Vetting is being undertaken. It is planned to commence operation during weekends in mid-June.</p> <p><b><u>Borrisokane CCTV:</u></b> The planned CCTV scheme for Borrisokane which has been sanctioned by the Garda Commissioner is now being progressed. Meetings have been held with consultants and property consents for installation of cameras are in place. Application has been made to ESB for required connections and Civils are now progressing.</p> <p><b><u>Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Clare Glens Project Development Measure – A planning application was submitted to An Coimisiún Pleanála thus completing the project that was funded under ORIS.</li><li>• Four submissions were received following the public consultation period, and we submitted our observations on these submissions to An Coimisiún Pleanála.</li><li>• Further information was requested and this was submitted.</li><li>• An Coimisiún Pleanála have indicated that notice needs to be given that further information has been submitted and an opportunity must be given for submissions to be made on this further information. This notice is currently being drafted.</li></ul> <p><b><u>Measure 3 of the Town Centre First Suite of Supports 2024:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• An amount of €45,000 was allocated under Measure 3 of the Town Centre First Suite of Supports 2024. This is for Project Development Measure Funding for Newport.</li><li>• The project provides for the development of a connection from the historic Ball Alley site with the town centre and ancillary public realm and amenity works through the provision of a footbridge. Project elements included the engagement of a multidisciplinary team to complete detailed design, planning, professional fees and a topographical survey.</li><li>• A Section 50 application has been approved by OPW to put bridge over the river.</li><li>• Planning was lodged to An Coimisiún Pleanála on the 30<sup>th</sup> October 2025. Four submissions were received by the closing date and TCC submitted our observations on same.</li></ul>
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- The case was decided on 27<sup>th</sup> March 2026, and permission was granted subject to conditions. The Commission was satisfied that the proposed development would be in accordance with the proper planning and sustainable development of the area.

**Participation Nation Outdoor Fund:**

Funding was secured in 2025 under the Participation Nation Outdoor Fund in conjunction with Sports Partnership for the installation of 3x3 Basketball Court and biodiversity measures at St. Paul's Playground, Nenagh. Works commenced in early November on this project. The planting associated with the biodiversity measures has been completed. The surface of the basketball court has also been completed, and the basketball hoop has been installed and is receiving a high level of usage. The remaining item (white lining) has now been completed.

**Grant Schemes:**

- Allocations under the Festivals & Events Grant Scheme were approved at the March meeting of Nenagh MD.
- Allocations under the Burial Grounds grant scheme were also approved at the March meeting.
- Allocations under the Residents' Associations, Tidy Towns and Contributions to Clubs & Organisations Schemes were approved at the April Meeting.
- Payment will issue as quickly as possible once all required documentation has been submitted.
- All grant allocations are subject to compliance with the associated terms & conditions of the relevant scheme and budget availability.

**Permits for use of Jetty in Ballina:**

Advertisement has been published inviting applications for permits for use of Jetty in Ballina for 2026/2027.

**Bus Stop Enhancement Programme:**

In 2025 €500,000 was allocated to Tipperary County Council under the Bus Stop Enhancement Programme. The following is the position in relation to bus stops in the Nenagh MD:

- Kilcommon- Design is done, a road safety audit needs to be undertaken. It is expected that the bus stops will be provided over the next few months.
- Portroe – nearing completion.
- Rearcross – nearing completion.
- Dromineer – nearing completion.
- Birdhill – tied in with Active Travel Scheme.
- Newtown – tied in with Active Travel Scheme.

**Nenagh Parking Arrangements:**

- The draft Bye-Laws and Nenagh Maps for the harmonisation of pay parking across the county were on public display in Nenagh MD up to 13<sup>th</sup> February 2026. The closing date for submissions was extended to 4.30 pm on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> March.



- Following requests from the Chamber of Commerce and the Nenagh Town Team signage has been erected in Nenagh to show the locations of car parks.

### **Placemaking Nenagh:**

#### **1. Painting and Enhancement Scheme**

- New scheme launched for 2026.
- Scheme has been advertised and applications invited. Note: This is also available in other towns and villages across the District.

#### **2. Nenagh Roundabout Scheme 2026 -2031**

- Following the tendering process signage has now been erected at two of the roundabouts covered by the scheme.
- Design of signage has been signed off for one other roundabout and this will be erected when it has been procured by the successful tenderer.

#### **3. Nenagh Tidy Towns**

- Following active engagement with Nenagh & District Tidy Towns there has been a significant increase in membership on the Tidy Towns Committee.
- A team of volunteers have come on board to assist with litter picking – areas being covered on a regular basis are the N52 bypass, Gortlandroe, the Dark Road, area around the Abbey, Lisbunny Industrial Estate and the Nenagh River Walk.
- Other areas are being picked as required.
- Nenagh CBS TY Students carried out weeding in the Castle Garden for three Wednesdays during May.
- Gaelscoil have undertaken a project to the rear of their school for biodiversity and enhancement.
- Nenagh College have been involved with the St. Paul's playground mural project.

#### **4. Events**

- Work is currently being co-ordinated by Nenagh Tourist Office on a varied and interesting programme for Heritage Week in August – this is in conjunction with Nenagh Heritage & Genealogy Centre, Nenagh Arts Centre, Nenagh Courthouse, Ormond Historical Society and Nenagh Castle.
- The programme for the Dromineer-Nenagh Literary Festival which takes place later in the year will be kickstarted with the DNLF Summer Series. This will include Booker Prize-winning author Roddy Doyle in conversation with Sarah Moore Fitzgerald at Tullamore Park on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> June – tickets now on sale.



	<p><b><u>Shane MacGowan Trail:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Guided tours are continuing every two weeks on Saturdays and are proving very successful.</li><li>• Recently there was a tourist who came from San Diego, California specifically to undertake the tour.</li><li>• Today, RTE are recording a piece for Morning Ireland on the Trail. A group of approx. 25 are taking part in a tour – this includes a group from the Netherlands, an individual from London and others from Clare, Dublin, Laois and other Irish locations. Some of these are repeat visitors.</li><li>• Plans are being developed for other special tours.</li></ul> <p>Cllr. J.P. O'Meara asked about signage for the use of jet skis in Dromineer and if an area will be marked out. Mr. L. Brett confirmed that he will follow up on this.</p>
<p><b>Item 12. To update members on the Works Programme.</b></p>	<p>The update on the Works Programme was circulated to members.</p> <p>Cllr. Morris expressed disappointment with the quality of the grass cutting. He was also concerned about the construction traffic to the work at the WWTP on the Old Birr Road. Cllr. Morgan Walsh supported his concerns and raised the issue of the lights at Newtown - they seem to take a while to change. She also referred to the bollards around the disabled parking spot in front of the CBS and said that this was unacceptable and that changes in the area were impacting on ratepayers. The IWA had been in contact.</p> <p>Cllr. Carroll said there are defects on the Newtown Bridge on the R494 and that the damaged fence on the R494 at Carrigatoher needs to be investigated. He asked if the possibility of a walkway from Garrykennedy to Portroe for people arriving in boats could be investigated, even if something could be done in stages.</p> <p>Cllr. Quirke O'Meara also raised the grass cutting, drainage issues on the R499 Silvermines to Limerick Road and from Shallee to Capparoo, solutions for speeding in Templeberry village. She asked if resurfacing work on the R499 could be added to the work programme as there is issue along this road due to the tailings pond and there has been many reps on it over the years.</p> <p>Cllr. Bonfield welcomed the traffic calming work that will be done in Newport but asked if some work could be done on areas that have sunken on the Cork Rd/Black Rd. Cllr. M. O'Meara requested an update on upgrading signs outside schools.</p> <p>Cllr. Bugler requested an update on the traffic calming work in Ballina. She asked if the area around the pumphouse and the exercise equipment could be tidied up and if the broken bollard and street furniture outside Tuscany could be removed. She asked about signage and the art piece for the new bridge. Other queries related to the footpath from Stonehall Estate to the graveyard, damage to the Washerwoman's Bridge and Darcy's</p>



	<p>Bridge on the R496 and the collapsed fence on the Iniscealtra Estate.</p> <p>Mr. B. Murphy explained that the grass cutting contract is for 2 years and this is the second year. It covers 40 cuts with a combination of mulching and collection. The contract is for over 100 acres. If every cut is collected it will increase the costs and very few contractors will have the capability to do this work. As work in the WWTP intensifies more may need to be done in the area, possibly traffic lights or manual controls but it is very limited what can be done. The bollards were put in front of the CBS school at the request of the school as it was very dangerous at drop off and pick up times. The provision of a disabled parking spot in the area can be examined.</p> <p>A structural engineer is looking at Newtown Bridge and recommendations will be made in this report. The fence in Carrigatoher would be under the remit of the TII. It is important that there are no environmental issues around the tailings pond in relation to the drainage issues on the Shallee to Capparoe Road. It is currently being finalised what work is to be done for the traffic calming in Ballina. The required work on the Washerwoman's Bridge will take 4 weeks. It would not be possible to provide a footpath from Stonehall to the graveyard as it is outside the speed limit. The remaining items will be added to CRM.</p> <p>Mr. K. Malone explained that the issue with the signs for schools is not part of the speed limit review. Mr. L. Brett informed members that the Arts Officer was working with Clare County Council in relation to the art piece for the bridge.</p>
