Paul Sheehan and Murilo Ortunho will lead a workshop and present a short participatory performance based on the outcomes of their week-long artistic residency at STAC Chapel. 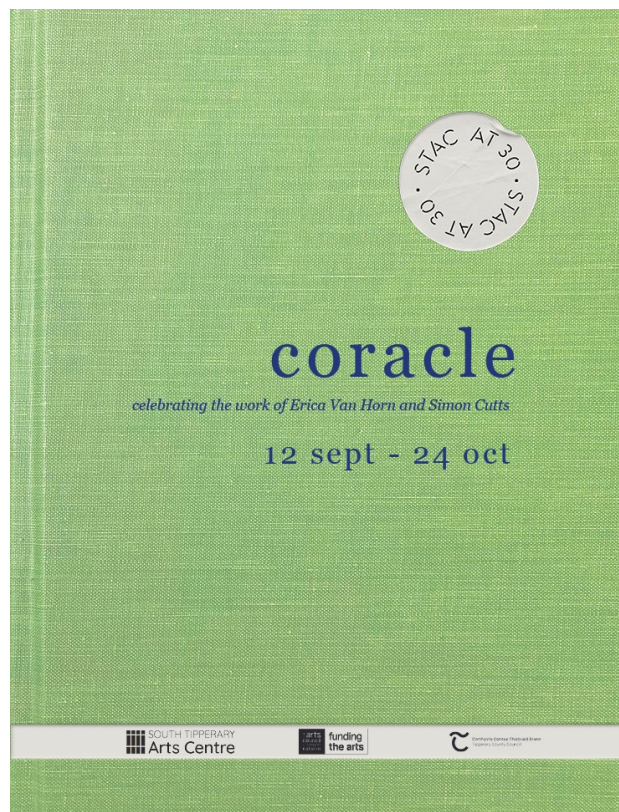
